Adverb common errors



Incorrect: He always has wanted to be famous.

Correct: He has **always** wanted to be famous

Incorrect: I carefully drive the car.

Correct: I drive the car **carefully**.

Incorrect: I am only free in the evening

Correct: I am free **only** in the evening

Incorrect: He plays football good.

Correct: He plays football well.

Good is an adjective. The adverb for this meaning is **well**.

Incorrect: I am much tired.

Correct: I am very tired.

Incorrect: I am working very hardly on this project

Correct: I am working very **hard** on this project

Incorrect: It is very hot to go out.

Correct: It is **too** hot to go out.

Incorrect: He angrily behaved.

Correct: He behaved angrily.

Adverbs of manner usually go in the end position.

Incorrect: Don't run **fastly**.

Correct: Don't run **fast**.

Incorrect: The child walks **slow**.

Correct: The child walks **slowly**.
