Prepositions


A preposition links nouns, pronouns and phrases to other words in a sentence.

The name “preposition” (pre + position) means “place before”. Prepositions usually come before another word, usually a noun or noun phrase:

- noun
- pronoun
- noun phrase
- gerund (verb in -ing form)

Examples:

- The book is **on** the table.
- The book is **beside** the table.
- I will see you **on** Monday.

In, at, to, by, over, above, since, far, for, from, with, of, off, on, out, up, upon, till, about, above, across, along, among, before, behind, below, beneath, beside, between, beyond, inside, outside, within, without

Some prepositions are composed of more than one word, which is called complex prepositions, some of them are as follows-

Prepositions are grammatical words that are fixed in number क्योंकि grammatical words वो words है जो संख्या में निश्चित होते है तथा जो grammar का निर्माण करते है, जिनके बिना Grammar अधूरी है इसके विपरीत vocabulary words होते है जिनकी संख्या निश्चित नहीं होती है तथा परिवर्तित होती रहती है जैसे noun, verb, adjective, adverb.

Top examples of prepositions with an explanation

Incorrect: They are not allowed to enter into the house.

Correct: They are not allowed to **enter the house**.

Explanations: The verbs lack, approach, resemble, order and enter are directly followed by objects without prepositions.

Incorrect: See you on next Friday.

Correct: See you **next Friday**.

Incorrect: I will never forget meeting him on that afternoon.

Correct: I will never forget meeting him **that afternoon**.

Explanation: Prepositions are not used before a number of common time expressions beginning next, last, this, one etc.

Incorrect: He is angry on me.

Correct: He is angry **with** me.

Explanation:–

Angry with : a person

Angry at : something

Ex:-I was angry **with** the treatment during the party.(**incorrect**)

I was angry **at** the treatment during the party.(**correct**)

Incorrect: My mother loves with me.

Correct: My mother loves me.

Incorrect: What is the time in your watch?

Correct: What is the time **by** your watch?

Incorrect: The train will arrive on the platform no. 3.

Correct: The train will arrive **at** the platform no. 3.

Incorrect: She died from Plague.

Correct: She died **of** plague.

Explanation:-

Died of : Illness

Died from : other reasons

He died from explosion. **(correct)**
